It is proposed to introduce a standalone Environment and Sustainability Department by realigning functions in the present Infrastructure and Environment Department (IED). At the same time. It is proposed that the three (3) sections currently forming the Coordination and Performance Department (CPD) transfer to other parts of the business, removing CPD from the council

structure. This will result in council retaining five (5) departments across its structure.
