### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This report provides a high level summary of the activation of the council managed community centres at Redbank Plains and Riverview.

In December 2023, Multicultural Australia relinquished the lease over the Redbank Plains Community Centre. Subsequently, in April 2024, the council resumed management of the Riverview and District Community Centre.

In response to these transitions, the Community and Cultural Services Branch identified the opportunity to develop a multiuse activation strategy and operational model aimed at addressing the community's social needs through provision of versatile, safe and inclusive locations capable of providing "multiple services and activities under one roof".

This report provides an update on the program activation since assuming management of both centres.

## PURPOSE OF REPORT/BACKGROUND

Councils' activation model of Community Centres is a direct outcome and delivery action of the City of Ipswich Community Development Strategy:

Pillar 1 - Capacity Building and Resilience

• Local community centres are supported and connected, share knowledge and information and deliver impactful social programming.

In December 2023, Multicultural Australia relinquished the lease over the Redbank Plains Community Centre, and in April 2024, council resumed management of the Riverview and Districts Community Centre. This transition prompted the Community and Cultural Services Branch to develop a multiuse activation strategy and operational model that serves the community's social needs through a multiuse service provision philosophy.

The revitalised management approach of the facilities has enabled council officers to work closely with community stakeholders, effectively addressing local needs and expanding service offerings. This has resulted in a significant rise in activation and occupancy levels, with both locations consistently achieving a 90% occupancy on a weekly basis.

Below is an outline of the existing programs and services offered at both facilities. It also highlights the new initiatives that have been launched as a direct result of the revised management in 2024.

### **CONCLUSION**

With this in mind the team continue to seek input from the community to build meaningful relationships to ensure both centres are serving the community's social needs through this multiuse model.
