EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This is a report concerning Council's FY2023-2024 Capacity Building Programs for local tourism businesses.

Vibrant and Growing

PURPOSE OF REPORT/BACKGROUND

Industry development, directly facilitated by council's Destination Development team or delivered via council's tourism industry associations and partnerships is a direct outcome and action of the current Destination Management Plan.

Council is committed to developing and growing the local tourism sector by establishing the region as an accessible day trip and short break destination within South-East Queensland. During FY2022-2023, Ipswich received 1.7m day trip visitors, 350,000 domestic overnight visitors staying a collective 1.5m visitor nights, generating record visitor expenditure of \$349 million.

Tourism industry cluster development is established as a key focus area within the Ipswich Destination Management Plan to support the continued development of the industry and visitor economy towards its greatest potential business and experience development.

In FY2023-2024, council has partnered with Brisbane Economic Development Agency (BEDA), the Regional Tourism Organisation (RTO) for the greater Brisbane tourism region, along with Logan City Council, Redland City Council, Moreton Bay City Council and Scenic Rim Regional Council to deliver a muti-faceted industry development program focusing on meeting consumer expectations and accessible tourism, with direct participation opportunities for Ipswich tourism businesses.

These programs deliver on the feedback and development priorities identified by our local operators in council's 2023 industry consultation. Business support was ranked the most important area for council to invest resources in, and 55 percent of our industry also ranked new experiences and consumer marketing as the areas they are most likely to invest additional resources in over the next four year period.

The following industry capacity building programs have been delivered or commenced since October 2023 with Ipswich tourism businesses actively participating in each.

Access Accelerator Program

Through our collaboration with BEDA and other greater Brisbane LGAs, two Ipswich businesses are participating in the Access Accelerator Program delivered by Spinal Life Australia. This Program aims to enhance the accessibility and inclusivity of the tourism industry across the greater Brisbane region, including the City of Ipswich. The program provides operators with one-on-one mentoring support over a six week period, equipping them with targeted knowledge, resources and support to enable the creation of environments that cater to the needs of individuals and disabilities, ensuring equal access to tourism experiences. Through participation in the program, operators will develop an ongoing Business Access and Inclusion Plan, the 2024 participants are:

- Ivory's Rock Events and Camping
- Queensland Pioneer Steam Railway

Best of Brisbane Region Experiences Support Program

The Best of Brisbane Region Experiences Support Program, developed in collaboration with Tourism and Events Queensland and BEDA's Local Government partners. This program enables businesses to work towards becoming identified as a Best of Queensland Experience by delivering exceptional visitor experiences to boost their bookings, sales and positive word of mouth through practical resources and mentoring support. This mentoring program has run for the past two years and was well received by the 12 Ipswich operators that received mentoring previously, the 2024 participants are:

- Banshees Bar and Art Space
- Monte Lane
- Rage Cage Smash Rooms and Rampage Axe Throwing

Transformational Experiences Mentoring Program:

Through our collaboration with Tourism and Events Queensland, Brisbane Economic Development Agency (BEDA) and other greater Brisbane LGAs, one Ipswich business is participating in the 2024 Transformational Experiences Mentoring Program. The Program runs over 12 weeks including one-to-one mentoring designed to empower participating operators to identify and implement actions to enhance their visitor experience in line with changing consumer expectations and to demonstrate this 'Travel for Good' ethos. This premium mentoring program ran for the first time in 2023 and was well received by local participants Floating Images and The Llama Farm, the 2024 participant is:

Ipswich Tourism Operators' Network – established in July 2011 the Ipswich Tourism Operators Network (ITON) brings together council's Destination Development Team and local business engaged and invested in the development of the City of Ipswich as a destination for leisure, corporate and event visitors.

Industry development is a key focus area of the Ipswich Tourism Operators Network, council's Destination Development Team and Economic Development Section to support the continued development of the industry and visitor economy. Capacity Building Programs empower participating operators to identify and implement actions to enhance their visitor experience to boost their bookings, sales and positive word of mouth through practical resources and mentoring support.
