IPSWICH 2032 SUMMIT

In July 2021 the IOC ratified Brisbane to host the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Stakeholders are now turning their attention to the next stage of planning for the Games, in particular identifying critical legacy and benefit outcomes and how best to achieve these over the years leading up to and the years following the Games.

City of Ipswich (Council), as a key member of the Council of Mayors South East Queensland and as an endorser of the 2032 Games Bid, will be a beneficiary of the Games in relation to legacy and ongoing benefits for the Ipswich region and its residents, businesses and broader community.

2. SUMMIT CONTEXT

The 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games are a catalyst to enhance social, economic and environmental outcomes for our communities.

The Ipswich 2032 Summit aims to align our community to identify and prioritise the path to 2032 and what legacy should be achieved for the people of Ipswich.


The below timeline captures significant milestones to date.



The 2032 Games are designed to be delivered across three main clusters:

- Brisbane 22 sports and 21 venues
- Gold Coast 8 sports and 7 venues
- Sunshine Coast 5 sports and 4 venues

Ipswich was identified to host the Modern Pentathlon at Springfield Central Stadium.



Council of Mayors South East Queensland has identified initial 2032 legacy aspirations as being:

- A Connected Region a region that is connected by world class transit and digital infrastructure that drives the region's economic connectivity.
- Australia's Most Liveable Region A region where residents enjoy a healthy, active, inclusive and sustainable lifestyle.
- A Thriving Regional Economy A region where residents, businesses and industry enjoy the benefits of a thriving, growing and diverse economy.
- A Global Identity South East Queensland will have an identity that is recognised around the world for its unique proposition.

There is an opportunity to engage with Summit participants to identify and prioritise the legacy opportunities for Ipswich in line with the above aspirations (with a focus on the first three points).

The following performance measures and targets will be applied to Council's delivery of the Ipswich 2023 Summit:

- Number of pre-event survey submissions
- A report with analysis of community sentiment and priorities based on the pre-event survey
- Attendance and engagement representative of Ipswich's community profile
- Participation percentage via live polling and commentary
- Priority action items based on attendee consensus
- Attendee satisfaction rating
