

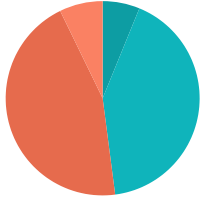
Landholder Partnerships Program

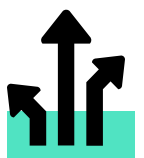
